THE PMEA DISTRICT 6 SCHOLARSHIP – Revised Oct 08

A \$500 scholarship is to be awarded to a deserving high school senior planning a career in Music Education. Successful candidates should be able to demonstrate success in performance, a love of music, and a strong desire to be a music educator.

Candidates

- Must be planning a career in Music Education
- Must have participated in one of the four District 6 festivals
- Must be a senior currently enrolled in a high school in District 6

The Application and Selection Process

1. The PMEA District 6 Scholarship application is available in the fall District 6 newsletter or online from the PMEA District 6 website.
2. The student should complete an application and gather supporting documents -
 - Application form
 - Recommendation of the high school principal
 - Recommendation of the high school director (PMEA member)
 - High school transcript
 - Verification of college application for the study of music education from the high school guidance counselor.
 - Acceptance to a college in Music Education (by the time of the interview)



3. Completed applications and other supporting documents are sent to the District 6 C/I Chairperson by April 1.
4. The scholarship committee will review the completed applications.
5. Applicants will be scheduled for an interview with members of the scholarship committee the first Saturday in May. Candidates must attend this interview in order to be considered for the scholarship.
6. The Scholarship Committee, after reviewing all applications and interviews, will make recommendations to the Executive Board.
7. Recommended applicants will be confirmed by the PMEA Executive Board at the May meeting.
8. Applicants will be notified and successful applicants and monetary awards will be announced by the Scholarship Committee.

Notes

The Scholarship Committee is headed by the District C/I Chair and includes the members of the District 6 C/I Committee and the District 6 President or other appointed officer.

Money will be sent directly to the person responsible who provides proof of payment to the college or university. This proof is sent directly to the District 6 Treasurer who will provide a check for the awarded amount.

The student's high school will be notified and the scholarship may be awarded at an appropriate ceremony if possible.

More than one award may be granted. Scholarships will not be less than \$ 500.00, but may exceed that amount if the Committee has funding and decides to so.

A Certificate of the Scholarship Award will be issued to the successful candidate.

Members of the executive committee having their own students as applicants will NOT vote in the confirmation process.

District 6 reserves the right to withhold the scholarship if no candidate meets the established criteria.
